SIX WEEKS, SIX R'S

In addition to our Monday night ministry, Exchange offers a class at First Baptist Orlando through their Wednesday night ACTS classes. This fall, our six-week class focused on many of the steps God uses to bring sexual wholeness and intimacy with Him: rescue, repentance, reading, roots, relationship, and restoration.

When people come to Exchange, most are in crisis. Many seek the ministry to rescue them, but they soon learn that rescue comes only through an intimate relationship with their Savior, Jesus Christ. In Christ, and through His Word, we know our true identity as beloved children of God, and we are emotionally connected to the perfect love of our Heavenly Father.

Rescue and restoration requires repentance, yet how we resist turning away from sin and turning to God! It can be very frustrating to pray for a child, relative, or friend and see very little change in that person's heart and behavior year after year. Be encouraged by Romans 2:4 which says, “It is God's kindness that leads us to repentance.”

Keep persevering in kindness. Keep your heart open and filled with hope. Keep offering loving acts of kindness when you get none in return. Keep listening and being patient. Keep enduring pain as you offer your whole self to God and to our loved one.

Jesus did this for you. He's never too busy for you. He never avoids conflict with you. He never minimizes your feelings

and needs. His heart is ever ready to receive you even when you hurt and betray Him. He knows that it is God's love you need, and He eagerly offers Himself to you. Offer yourself to your loved one as Christ offers Himself to you.

We may not see everything accomplished in this life that we pray for, but we can never lose when we love selflessly over and over. If this love doesn't change our loved one, it will change us. We will become the joy-filled, caring people we were made to be. It is not easy at all. It is the hardest thing we do in life, but it is the greatest. And we have God to help us. Great is His faithfulness (Lamentations 3:23)!
