As Director of Exchange and as a mother of a three-year old, I daily ask God to help me put the most important thing first: relationships. I have to nurture my relationship with God, my family, and those God sends to me in my neighborhood and church. It's not easy, but life,



work, and church would be a misery without seeking and attaining this intimacy with God and others.

Judson Edwards wrote: "Only when we die to self can we fully love one another."

Too often, our ministries and personal lives suffer when we don't put relationships first and care for one another. We who are called by God to be shepherds can be more concerned about ourselves than the flock entrusted to us. Phillip Keller, in his classic book: *A Shepherd Looks at the Good Shepherd* writes:

"There are ministers, teachers, scholars, writers, and leaders who pose as champions of Christianity. But when the enemy comes in they are shown their true colors. They back away rather than risk a confrontation. They settle for withdrawal rather than beard the lion or bear or assail the wolf. They run and flee in the face of violent attack. Others remain silent while their people are deceived, harried, and driven to despair. Only the Good Shepherd cares enough for His own to lay down His life for them" (p. 244)

May we as parents, sisters and brothers, caretakers, neighbors, pastors and leaders have the courage and compassion to nurture those God has entrusted to us - in our homes, churches and ministries. In doing so, we will experience joy and "life to the full" as God promised us (John 10:10).

For almost 30 years, Exchange Ministries has been affiliated with Exodus International. In 2012 Exchange removed its

affiliation with Exodus due to its increasingly compromised views regarding a Biblical understanding of homosexuality, and God's ability to change lives.
